Cameron is a high school history teacher and is responsible for the strategic leadership of learning and teaching, innovation, and promoting excellence in teaching practice at Shore School in Sydney. He has earned four Masters degrees, most recently a Master in Education (Learning and Teaching) from Harvard. He taught in the Harvard teacher education program, and he works as faculty at the Project Zero Classroom, as an online course instructor, and as a facilitator at the Principal's Center. He initiated and co-leads the Project Zero Australia Network, which provides free professional development for educators.

He has received multiple national and international awards, including the Dr Paul Brock Medal from the Australian College of Educators, and has also received a Churchill Fellowship and the 21st Century International Global Innovation Award for Teaching.

Cameron is the co-editor of *Flip the System Australia: What matters in education* and he is a staff writer about innovation in education for *Getting Smart*. He is a passionate advocate for student voice, teacher agency, and shifting the dial from 'how do I cover the content' to 'what sort of learners are we trying to produce?'
